INSIGHTS INTO THE SESSION

AND SOME MAJOR HIGHLIGHTS...

300+ drives held in the session of 2020-21, with 220+ companies hiring interns, 23+ pre-placement offers, and 65+ companies recruiting for jobs.

120+ internship offers with 100% companies in commerce, 78.74% in science and 82.67% in arts.

70+ offers were provided to the current batch of 2020-21 with 91% offers in commerce, 88% in science and 79% in arts.

Highest CTC awarded for the session 2020-21 was INR 19,25,000 by DE Shaw Group as opposed to INR 10,00,000 in the previous session.

The highest stipend offered was INR 30,000 by Baymax Technologies and Pick My Work.

The average CTC and the average stipend was scaled up to INR 4,68,640 and INR 5,079 respectively.

10% offers in Tier A, 62% in Tier B and 28% were in Tier C.

180+ students from diverse courses were selected for internships.

54.66% of students who applied through the cell were hired.

Maitreyi College is a constituent college of the University of Delhi. It has been accredited with Grade A by NAAC and comes under few top colleges of India. An all women's college, it offers various degrees in the fields of arts, commerce and science to over 3000+ students.

The cell flourished tremendously, adapting to a virtual model of operation, showing significant growth in the number of offers provided and an expansion in the profiles offered.

The whole virtual session of 2020-21, the Placement Cell capitalised on the available opportunities and provided students with various upskilling sessions. These included a professional CV Assistance and LinkedIn Profile Building session to train the students on how to construct a Resume and an attractive profile. The cell also conducted other frequent training programs in Leadership Development, a Placement Preparation program with FlinkHub and many more. For final year students, the cell provided fellowship opportunities with Teach For India and CPL (Citizen for Public Leadership).

The Cell additionally collaborated with Coursera to provide students with free access to online courses from foreign universities.

The digitally packed session ended on a high note with the highly successful, virtually managed - ENVISION 3.0, The Annual Internship & Job Fair.

The Placement Cell is truly a forum of the students, by the students and for the students. The Cell is operated by the students of the College under the aegis of its Teacher Coordinator Dr. Pawan Sharma and The Convener Dr. Anurita Jalan to provide students with jobs & internships of their choice.

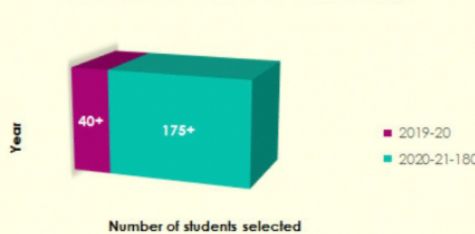

Comparison of Number of companies offering Internship



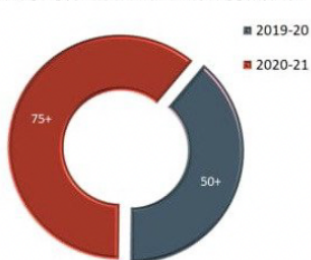
220+ companies offered internships in 2020-21 as compared to 130+ in 2019-20. 69.23% increase in the number of companies offering internship.

Students Selected for Internship



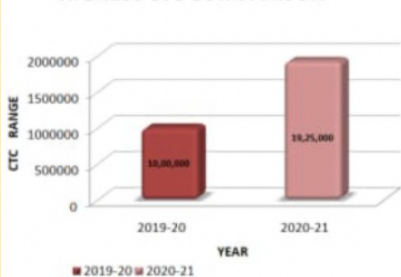
180+ students got selected this year. The ratio increased by 267.35% as compared to 2019-20

NUMBER OF OFFERS MADE BY THE COMPANY



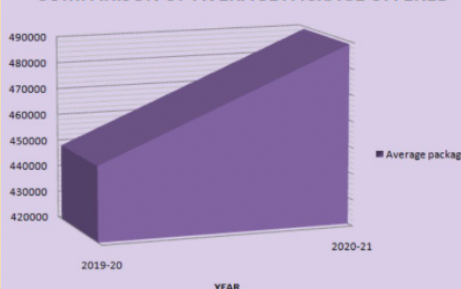
56% rise in the diversity of profiles offered as compared to session 2019-20.

650+ registrations from all over Delhi were recorded.

250+ Maitreyi students from various institutions with their desired internships/jobs.

36% students in commerce stream, 23% students in science stream and 41% students in arts stream, bagged opportunities in different companies/NGOs.

Internships and jobs from 50+ companies like Bajaj Capital, eigoPaathshala, Zone Media, Digifuse

80+ diverse profiles ranging from international relations to web designing.

Total 29 paid and 22 unpaid internships, offering average stipend of INR 5,000 and the average CTC from 10+ jobs ranged up to INR 3.4 LPA.

The highest stipend offered through the fair was INR 25,000 by EigoPaathshala and the highest CTC offered was INR 6.9 LPA by Newzera.

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
